All members of a project team have a responsibility towards health and safety, being a designer is no different. Here are some ways you can help promote safety in your projects...

Have you obtained the Show Manual and shared this with the build team?

Have you checked the Organisers Space Only Stand Rules and Regulations?
(Essential information to ensure your design concept meets with organiser rules and regulations)

Have you designed your stand in line with the latest E-Guide regulations?

Have you confirmed the build-up and breakdown times and considered if your design is achievable? (It is important to ensure there is suitable time to safely complete installation and dismantling)

Have you considered if your stand design requires structural calculations i.e. is a Complex Structure?
